of marriage on September 6th. In today's society where divorce or just living together is rampant, a loving and long term marriage is truly unique. As we admire their life together as




husband and wife, it certainly serves as an example of how God blesses the institution of marriage. Wouldn't it be wonderful if our society still embraced these values?

Stewardship

“Being a Steward Like Joseph”

Do you like to be in charge? What do you think it takes to be a strong leader? What attributes are required of a good manager or a corporate executive? Do you think you have what it takes to head a committee, a government, or even a country?

Take Joseph, for example. You remember him – the kid with the coat of many colors? His brothers certainly had no respect for him. In fact, they had hatred for him, because they saw him as his daddy’s favorite. They were so jealous they got rid of him – sold him as a slave to go who-knows-where. They didn’t care. But God did. Throughout the narrative of Joseph in Genesis 37-50, the words, “And God was with him,” are repeated. He was so honest, so smart, such a good administrator that he was elevated to the next-to-highest position in the country of Egypt. All because “God was with him.” It was Joseph’s task to save up food from the seven good years to last through the seven years

of famine. He did such a great job that, not only were the Egyptians fed, people from other countries came to Joseph to get grain for food, too. Among them, you know, were Joseph’s brothers.

Now Joseph had the upper hand. Now he had the power. Now he could decide their fate. When they realized who he was, they were scared! After all, look what they had done to him! But Joseph forgave. Joseph said, “As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive...” (Genesis 50:20). Joseph realized that all he had – his life, his wisdom, his job, and being reunited with his family after many years – all these were gifts from God. God had

been directing Joseph’s path his whole life. Everything in Joseph’s life – the ups and downs – God

used to make him the leader he was, to make him a blessing to all around him.

Keep that in mind when things happen that are unpleasant, even painful. It’s even more important to

keep that in mind when things are going well (because that’s when we’re tempted to forget about God). God uses everything to mold you into the person He wants you to be, to prepare you for the work He wants you to do in this life, and to shape you into a steward who uses His gifts in service to God by serving others.


Scrip Orders: The school's scrip program is a great way for parents, grandparents, family and friends to help pay for tuition! 50% of each scrip order's profit may be desig-

A NEW SCHOOL YEAR?!

How was it for you? The first eight or nine Septembers of your school “career,” that is. Can you remember how big the place looked through preschool or kindergarten-size eyes? Can you remember the smile on the face of that special teacher? Were you ever the new kid in the class? How did you feel when you were the graduating class with only a year’s worth of studies between you and your next school? What frightened you most about those early days in a new grade?

So many questions! Your children have them too. While their answers may not be the same as yours, you can probably relate to the uncertainty that students face as they begin a new school year. For the youngest students, the biggest uncertainty may be how they’re going to make it through the first day without you. Middle grade children may feel secure now that they have several years of school “under their belt.” But deep inside they may wonder how they’ll succeed with those long division problems they saw on the chalkboard last year or if they’ll get to sit with their best friends at lunch. Older students may not worry so much about academic achievement as social success and that can cause real insecurity.

Remember those days, and share your memories. Tell your children about the rough times and the good times. Oh, don’t preach, “When I was your age...” Instead, give them a little history lesson about your life and times in school. Find something to laugh about. Let your children know that you recall what it’s like to “be a kid.” Most of all pray for your child or your grandchildren as they begin a new chapter in their lives. Trust God! Share His promise with your child, that He will be with them and you every day of this school year!


